



Figure 2. Self Clamped Inductive Switching Current vs Inductance







Figure 3. Collector to Emitter On-State Voltage vs Junction Temperature

Figure 4.Collector to Emitter On-State Voltage vs Junction Temperature






Figure 5. Collector Current vs Collector to Emitter On-State Voltage

Figure 7. Collector to Emitter On-State Voltage vs Collector Current




Figure 8. Transfer Characteristics




Figure 9. DC Collector Current vs Case Temperature




Figure 10. Threshold Voltage vs Junction Temperature




Figure 11. Leakage Current vs Junction Temperature





Figure 12. Switching Time vs Junction Temperature





Figure 13. Capacitance vs Collector to Emitter Voltage

Figure 15. Breakdown Voltage vs Series Gate Resistance





Figure 16. IGBT Normalized Transient Thermal Impedance, Junction to Case





Figure 17. Inductive Switching Test Circuit

Figure 18.  $t_{ON}$  and  $t_{OFF}$  Switching Test Circuit








Figure 20. Energy Waveforms
